Enter right, a chorus of female students, dressed in ballet costumes and full make-up. Their hands are clasped behind them, and they appear very lugubrious. The male and female students line up in front of the stage.

FEMALE STUDENTS (Cuddling closer.)


Come now, Professors dear, I know, You'll let us have our Capping show.
